The rank of the selected candidate will depend upon the candidate's qualifications. The successful candidate will mainly join our Institute for the Promotion of Excellence in Higher Education, where s/he will be expected to teach general management and English for economics and management for undergraduate students. In addition, there will be opportunities to teach advanced management for graduate students at the Graduate School of Economics.

Full-time (Non-tenured).

The initial contract term is three years and one month (until March 31, 2019). The contract is renewable, based on internal evaluation of teaching and research, only once for a maximum of two years up to March 31, 2021.

Treatments

Salary is competitive, commensurate with qualifications and experience. Enrollment in the social insurance system, which consists of Employees' Health Insurance, Employees' Pension Insurance, and the Employment Insurance, is required. Kyoto University will cover half of the insurance costs. Working hours will require availability from 8:30 am to 5:15 pm Monday to Friday during the school year. Paid holidays are provided depending on the number of years working at our university.
