Alternative Solutions

☐ Food Sovereignty / Right to the Food for All

 Right of peoples to define their own food and agriculture systems, in contrast to having food subject to international market forces

■ Alternative Agriculture

- Local knowledge and resources
 - + scientific knowledge and resources → Agroecology
 - enough potential to feed the world in a sustainable way

☐ Alternative Science and Technology

 Science research, technology development and extension should be publicly reorganised and promoted

■ Alternative Trade

- Need to reset the WTO rules and stop FTA/EPA/TPP
- Need to regulate market speculations and neoliberal forces
