needy [adj]

having very little food or money

divert [vt]

to change the use of something such as time or money

to change the direction in which something travels

roll out [phv]

launch or introduce a new product, initiative, etc. (on a massive scale)

accusation [n] < accuse [vt +of]

a statement saying that someone is guilty of a crime or of doing something wrong

audit [vt, n]

to officially examine a company's financial records in order to check that they are correct

cut down on [phv]

reduce

rubbish [n, vt, adj]

food, paper etc that is no longer needed and has been thrown away [=AE: garbage, trash]

an idea, statement, etc that is rubbish is silly or wrong and does not deserve serious attention

make the most of [idiom]

to take full advantage of something because it may not last long
